The Girl Scouts of the Philippines is invited to send participants to the 2013 International Camp of the Girl Scout of Korea (GSK) to be held in Gosan Recreation Forest in Wanju-gun, Jeollabuk-do on July 28 to August 3, 2013.

GSK's International Camp is held every two years. This year's theme is "We, Lead the Change".

OBJECTIVE

The camp aims to provide Girl Scouts/Guides and Scouts with following opportunities:

- to radiate their youthfulness by participating in a variety of activities which meet their needs
- to foster an appreciation for nature and responsibility for nature conservation through camping in nature
- to enhance world citizenship by interacting with participants who have diverse backgrounds, sharing international friendship and caring for each other through camping life

The event is equipped with various interesting programs and dynamic events for 7,000 participants, including 250 overseas Girl Scouts/Guides and Scouts from all over the world.

Open to all Senior and Cadet Girl Scouts aged 12 years and above and adult leaders. There is no minimum as to the number of participants per Member Organization.

Home hospitality for two nights and three days from July 26 to 28 or from August 3 to 5, 2013 for the overseas participants will be provided.

TENTATIVE PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Troop Friendship Night
- International Night
- Leaders' Night/ Young Leaders' Night
- Gatherings of Rose of Sharon Girl Scouts (the highest honor of Cadet Girl Scouts) and Gold Girl Scouts (the highest honor of Senior Girl Scouts)
- Closing Ceremony

2. Exhibition

- International Exhibition
 - This will be arranged during the whole camp period. Two to three countries will be assigned in a tent (5m x 5m). GSK will provide one or two tables (1.8m x 0.9m) for each country with prior request. Each participating Member Organization is encouraged to introduce some programs that represent its culture and tradition such as song, game, and dance at the exhibition booth.
